From Note to Song

Change one letter in the first word to form a new word; then keep changing one letter at a time to form new words until you have formed the target word. For example, to move from WIND to SING, you could form the words WIND \rightarrow WIN<u>G</u> \rightarrow SING.

The Clues provide hints about the words you will form when you change letters to move from NOTE to TUNE, from TUNE to BEAT, and from BEAT to SONG. The first word (TOTE) has been filled in for you.
